

Federal Work-Study Program Information Sheet

What is the FWS program?

The FWS program is a federal aid program which allows students to work part-time on campus. The program allows students to earn money and gain experience related to their major.

How many hours can I work?

The FWS program is designed as a part-time opportunity. Students are able to work a maximum of 16 hours per week. Students will be notified of the dates that they are allowed to work during each semester.

How much will I be paid?

FWS students will be paid at least minimum wage. The California minimum wage rate is currently \$13 per hour. Returning FWS students will be paid more hourly depending on their experience.

How and when will I be paid?

FWS students will be paid monthly on the 10th day of the month. Students can choose to pick up a paper paycheck at the cashier's office, have a paper check mailed to their home address, or sign up for direct deposit into their existing bank accounts. Students will need to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and answer 'yes' to the question which asks: "Are you interested in being considered for workstudy?" This question can be found in the Student Demographics section of the FAFSA.
